
The Lake Nipissing Weather Buoy By Terry Lang

Flags, Flags, and More Flags By Carol Gibson



Donation made to CPS Foundation By Mike Eedy

After long discussion and debate, the bridge has agreed on what to donate to the CPS Foundation.

The CPS Foundation is a charitable corporation, established in 1976.

Its purpose is to further the efforts of all Squadrons of Canadian Power & Sail Squadrons (CPS). While it serves as the repository for memorial gifts (official receipts available on request), it solicits other donations. The Foundation ensures that the disbursement of specified monies is used to help strengthen the mission of CPS.

The "Disbursement Quota", defined by regulation as the minimum percentage of the proceeds of the fund that must be dispensed by the Foundation, is used to assist in CPS projects. The remaining interest earned is used to build the fund. By design, this fund, subscribed to by today's longer-sighted and caring boat men and women, will one day totally fund the boating education needs of the boating community.

All memorial gifts are acknowledged to the donor, and an appropriate notice is sent to the person specified. Gifts, contributions and bequests are all tax-deductible. Donations of securities or property are subject to acceptance by the Directors of the Foundation. Gifts may be directed to the CPS Foundation, c/o CPS HQ.

Each year, at least one significant project is funded by the Foundation. Tooling for the CPS Plotter is a good example. Revenue from plotter sales now provides working capital directly to CPS and will continue to do so. Providing funds for a revised edition of the Boat Pro Manual was one of the most financially successful projects. The Manual, which is accredited by Canadian Coast Guard, is a study guide for operator proficiency. Most Squadrons responded to the new boater education challenge, boosting membership and Squadron finances. Another major project was funding the CPS Distance Education Program. This moved CPS into the real world of today and provided an electronic communications base on which to build.

Since 1983, the Foundation has returned over \$125,000.00 to CPS! Currently the CPS Foundation has about \$280,000 in it...and that number never gets touched...the interest (about \$12,000,00 this year) is all that is used.

Each squadron was urged to become members of an honor roll whereby they donate \$1.00 per registered member. Squadrons donating one dollar per member receive a Certificate of Merit and a place on the Honour Roll. Districts qualify for Honour Roll Status when all of their Squadrons qualify. The Honour Roll is published annually at the CPS Conference.

At the March 21, 2000 Bridge meeting, The North Bay Power and Sail Squadron bridge has agreed to become members of the honor roll, but not the 100% Honour Roll which would mean donating \$1 per member since 1983 or aprox \$2,880. However we believe that this is a very worthwhile project and will donate \$2.00 per member for the past year (\$314), and have agreed to review the yearly Honour Roll donation every year.
