It has been a while since I last submitted something for Crosschop. Last year's Boating season was filled with disappointment for some, yet for others it was an excellent summer as a result of fair weather. With this year's Boating season approaching, hopefully the water levels are a little higher so the deep draft boats can launch. I trust that all of you will take advantage in whatever way you can to hone your seamanship skills. Try a little rougher weather, complete a few short voyages under full darkness or refine your anchoring methods to suit those more challenging anchorages. I cannot emphasize enough that boating at the dock just doesn't cut it. You may be pleasantly surprised that you can do it, do it safely and have fun in doing so.

I'll repeat my on-going com-

ment about safety gear - Is it in good condition and current? Do you have any system upgrades or long overdue maintenance that needs to be done? Please be sure that any maintenance or upgrades that you have completed were done properly and safely. You don't want to have an accident or fire on board because you did a job poorly as a result of a lack of knowledge or worse - carelessness. For those of you that completed major refits last summer or over winter, be sure everything is ship-shape before launch. Double check equipment and systems, particularly those who were not able to use their vessel last summer. A lack of use can lead to corrosion or premature failure.

The Squadron has a Boating Course underway which George Graham and I are instructing. We would both welcome anyone to come in and volunteer an hour of time to discuss your favorite area of interest in safe boating and navigation, anchoring, etiquette etc. Please promote the squadron in your day-to-day conversations and don't forget about some of the elective or advanced courses. Next fall I would enjoy instructing Seamanship (Piloting) so please mention that around the squadron and docks and hopefully we can attract more than enough interest for a course.

Please consider volunteering a few hours each month as a member of the Bridge. There are several positions currently open and the work load is minimal.

Enjoy a safe boating season and promote safe boating. Cast me a salute from the waves.

There are Changes in Applying for a Pleasure Craft Licence

From the Transport Canada Website:

Did you know that any pleasure craft powered by a motor over 10 hp (7.5 kW) must have a valid licence? A pleasure craft licence allows search and rescue personnel and other agencies to quickly identify your boat in the event of an emergency.

As of November 1, 2010, to get your free pleasure craft licence, you must mail the following documents to the Pleasure Craft Licensing Centre:

 a completed application form;
 proof of vessel ownership; and
 a signed copy of a valid piece of government-issued identification. (Further information is available on the form.)

Application forms are available for download or for pickup in person through your local Service Canada Centre. For Service Canada locations, visit www.servicecanada.gc.ca

- > Apply for a new licence
- > Transfer an existing licnece
 > Update your licence information
- > Obtain a duplicate licence
- > Cancel your licence

Changes to Minimum Safety Equipment required

New requirements for safety equipment and pleasure craft licensing came out on May 12, 2010. To find out how these new requirements may affect you, we recommend that you check out this information.

The Small Vessel Regulations set out the minimum safety equipment required on board a pleasure craft according to its type and length. To determine the length of your pleasure craft, refer to your manufacturer's product information or measure it yourself - from the forward end of the foremost outside surface of the hull shell to the after end of the aftermost outside surface of the hull shell.

There are minimum safety equipment requirements for your pleasure craft in each of the following categories:

Personal watercraft (PWC) Paddleboats and watercycles Sailboards and kiteboards Sail and powered pleasure craft up to 6 m (19'8") Sail and powered pleasure craft over 6 m and up to 9 m (19'8"-29'6") Sail and powered pleasure craft over 9 m and up to 12 m (29'6"-39'4") Sail and powered pleasure craft over 12 m and up to 24 m (78'9") Requirements for pleasure craft up to 24 m (78'9")
